FOREIGN STUDENT ENROLLMENT 1966-67

We are pleased to present a summary of the foreign student enrollment at Cornell for the academic year 1966-67. This year 1107 foreign students are enrolled, an increase of only 9 over last year. Our figures actually indicate a decrease of 66 entering students over last year. The overall increase appears to be due to a registration of 75 more returning students over last year.

Foreign students, representing 84 countries, make up 8.3% of the total Cornell student enrollment in Ithaca. Canadian students represent the largest national group (215) followed by Indians (118) and Chinese (105).

The University has 313 undergraduate foreign students enrolled, a slight decrease from last year. Foreign students make up 3.3% of the total undergraduate student enrollment. The School of Hotel Administration continues to register the highest percentage (11.8%) of foreign students in the undergraduate divisions followed by the College of Architecture (5.6%) and the College of Agriculture (4.7%).

Graduate foreign students number 794, a slight increase over last year. They comprise 20.6% of the total number of graduate students enrolled in the University. This includes those students enrolled in The Graduate School and Master's degree candidates in the Graduate School of Business and Public Administration, and the Graduate School of Aerospace Engineering.

For those interested in the figures on enrollment of foreign students across the nation we quote from the census conducted by the Institute of International Education for 1965-66 and summarized in their annual publication OPEN DOORS. According to their figures, 82,709 foreign students from 158 countries and territories were enrolled in 1755 U.S. colleges and universities. It is of interest to note that half of this foreign student population (41,354) was concentrated in only 47 colleges and universities, each of which reported an enrollment of 400 or more foreign students. The 3 institutions with the greatest numbers were (1) University of California with 4535 (5.7% of their total enrollment), (2) New York University with 2599 (6.3%), (3) Columbia University 2539 (10.1%). Cornell with 7.4% ranked 4th in percentage of foreign students to total enrollment.

Engineering was selected by 22% of all foreign students. The humanities called 20%, and 18% were enrolled in the physical and natural sciences. The social sciences claimed 15% and business administration 10%. Five per cent were enrolled in education and 4% in agriculture.

The Far East continues to dominate the area representation with 29,049 or 35% of the total, followed by Latin America with 13,998 (17%) and the Near and Middle East 11,217 (14%). In all areas the trend is toward increased graduate enrollment.

The Cornell distribution of foreign students by country and college or school is attached with a list of the graduate student enrollment by department.
