## FOREIGN STUDENT ENROLLMENT 1967-68

We are pleased to present a summary of the foreign student enrollment at Cornell for the academic year 1967-68. A total of 1068 students from abroad are enrolled this year, a decrease of 39 from last year.

Foreign students, representing 86 countries, make up 7.8% of the total Cornell student population in Ithaca. Canadian students comprise the largest national group (201) followed by Chinese (106) and Indians (91).

Graduate foreign students number 745, a decrease of 49 from 1966-67. Our foreign graduate students make up 21.3% of the University Graduate School enrollment. Graduate level enrollment, including The Graduate School and the Schools of Aerospace Engineering, Business and Public Administration, and Law is 18.5%.

The University has 323 undergraduate foreign students enrolled, an increase of 10 over last year. They comprise 3.4% of the total undergraduate enrollment. Undergraduate schools or colleges with the highest percentage of foreign students are Hotel Administration 11.9%, Agriculture 4.9%, and Architecture 4.6%.

For those interested in the national enrollment of foreign students, we have figures from the annual census compiled by the Institute of International Education and summarized in their publication OPEN DOORS. According to their figures for 1966-67, there were 100,262 foreign students representing 172 countries and territories. These students studied at 1797 institutions of higher learning in the U.S. Of the total, 53% were concentrated in 58 colleges and universities, each of which reported an enrollment of 400 or more foreign students. The three universities with the greatest number of foreign students were (1) University of California 5787 (6.6% of total enrollment), (2) New York University 2646 (6.5%), (3) Columbia University with 2565 (10.1%). Cornell ranked 9th in percentage of foreign students to total enrollment with 8%.

As for fields of study, Engineering (22%) continues to attract the highest number of students. The humanities were elected by 20%, and 17% were enrolled in the physical and natural sciences. The social sciences claimed 15%. There were 10% in Business Administration, 6% in Education, 5% in Medical Sciences, and 3% in Agriculture.

The Far East again dominated the area representation with 33,570 (33.5%) of the total, followed by Latin America with 18,182 (18.1%). Europe ranked third with 14,207 (14.2%). In all areas the trend continues toward increased graduate student enrollment.

The Cornell distribution of foreign students by country and college or school is attached with a list of the graduate student enrollment by department.
