FOREIGN STUDENT ENROLLMENT
1973-74

We are pleased to present a summary of the foreign student enrollment at Cornell University for the academic year 1973-74. A total of 1165 students from abroad are enrolled this year, a decrease of 34 (2.9%) from last year.

Foreign students, representing 92 countries, make up 7.2% of the total Cornell student population in Ithaca. Canadian students comprise the largest national group (171) followed by Chinese (151) and Indians (79).

Graduate foreign students number 837, an increase of 18 over 1972-73. Our foreign graduate students make up 21.8% of the University Graduate School enrollment. Graduate level enrollment, including The Graduate School and the Schools of Business and Public Administration, Law and the Veterinary College is 17.9%.

The University has 328 undergraduate foreign students enrolled, a decrease of 52 from last year. They comprise 2.9% of the total undergraduate enrollment. Undergraduate schools and colleges with the highest percentage of foreign students are Hotel Administration 14.8%, Engineering 4%, and Architecture 2.9%.

The distribution of foreign students by country, college and school is attached with a list of graduate level enrollment by department.
