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FOREIGN STUDENT ENROLLMENT
1974-75

We are pleased to present a summary of Cornell's foreign student enrollment for the academic year 1974-75. A total of 1131 students from abroad are enrolled this year, a decrease of 34 (2.9%) from last year.

Foreign students, representing 92 countries, make up 7% of the total Cornell student population in Ithaca. Canadian students comprise the largest national group (154) followed by Chinese (143) and Indians (73).

Graduate foreign students number 814, a decrease of 23 from 1973-74. Our foreign graduate students make up 21.5% of the University Graduate School enrollment. Graduate level enrollment, including The Graduate School and the Schools of Business and Public Administration, Law, and the Veterinary College is 17.5%.

The University has 317 undergraduate foreign students enrolled, a decrease of 11 from last year. They comprise 2.7% of the total undergraduate enrollment. Undergraduate schools and colleges with the highest percentage of foreign students are Hotel Administration 12.9%, Architecture 3.9%, and Engineering 3.1%.

The distribution of foreign students by country, college and school is attached with a list of graduate level enrollment by department.
